Item

The aim of the Alluvial Forest working group within the Interregproject "De Rijn Verbindt / Der Rhein Verbindet" (DRV) is to develop a cross-border strategy to expand the floodplain forests and create a German-Dutch floodplain forest biotope network on the Rhine. The first workshop in December 2023 focused on the theoretical basics, hydraulic framework conditions and hydronumerical modeling. The second workshop is dedicated to the questions of the expansion and management of the floodplain forests in the Rhine floodplain in the field of interests between ecology, flood protection and shipping.

After an information and exchange session with practicioners on the different approaches and experiences on waterways, we want to elaborate the various fields of action in thematic working groups and develop specific basics and approaches for a riparian forest strategy.
